(AGORA) Global Online Research System on Agriculture

Global Online Research in Agriculture (AGORA) The AGORA program, established by the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations and major publishers, provides developing countries with online access to an exceptional collection of bibliographic material in the fields of food, agriculture, environmental science and related social sciences. AGORA provides institutions in more than 115 countries with a collection of 14,500 journals and 27,000 books. AGORA is designed to enhance the education of thousands of students, teachers and researchers in the fields of agriculture and the life sciences in the developing world. AGORA is one of five programs that make up Research4Life: AGORA, HINARI, OARE, ARDI and GOALI.

AGORA: is an outstanding digital library collection in the fields of food and agriculture.

Hinari: is one of the world's largest collections of biomedical and health literature.

ARDI: gives access to scientific and technical information.

GOALI: focuses on law and social sciences, including politics, economics, philosophy, history and more.

OARE: collects information resources on environment, including ecology, geography, energy and more.



OARE - Online Access to Research in the Environment

Launched in 2006, OARE (Online Access to Research in the Environment) is managed by the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) in partnership with Yale University and up to 75 publishers. OARE provides more than 3,200 institutions access to up to 11,000 journals, up to 22,000 e-books, and up to 55 other information resources in a wide range of disciplines contributing to our understanding of the natural environment, including environmental toxicology and pollution, zoology, botany, ecology, environmental chemistry, geology, hydrology, oceanography, meteorology, climatology, geography, environmental economics, environmental law and policy, conservation policy and planning, environmental biotechnology, environmental engineering, energy, and many other disciplines.



AJOL - African Journals OnLine

(AJOL) is the world's largest online library of peer-reviewed, African-published scholarly journals. Historically, scholarly information has flowed from North to South and from West to East. It has also been difficult for African researchers to access the work of other African academics. In partnership with hundreds of journals from all over the continent, AJOL works to change this, so that African-origin research output is available to Africans and to the rest of the world.

AJOL hosts 521 Journals, including 245 Open Access Journals, The site has 13 175 Issues containing 155 751 Abstracts. There are 149 993 Full Text Articles for download, of which 92 976 are Open Access.



African Union Common Repository

The African Union (AU) Common Repository acquires processes and preserves materials of enduring value to the organization, produced by the African Union, researchers, AU constituents such as regional offices and collaborating partners. The Common Repository brings together all official AU documents, including but not limited to conference working papers, reports, departmental reports, studies commissioned by the AU as well as correspondence.



E-conferencing system

The system displays all Working Documents of the past 25 Summit since 2008 and documents of the upcoming Summit (Addis Ababa, Ethiopia February 2020) and all Decisions and Declaration of OAU/AU from 1963 to date. The portal would provide all the documents in all AU working languages (English, French, Arabic & Portuguese).

- All working documents of the past Summits (from 2008 to-date)
- All AU Assembly Decisions/Resolutions and Declarations since Durban 2002 to-date
- All AU Executive Council Decisions/Resolutions since Durban 2002 to.
- All OAU Assembly of Heads of State and Government Resolutions/Decisions from 1963 to 2002.
- All Council of Ministers Resolutions from 1963 to 2002.
